The Enclosure Commissioners called it Luzborough Road because it led from the lane to Ampfield (now Green Lane) 'over the north west side of Carters Common to the Turnpike road from Romsey to Botley at Luzborough Corner'. Admiral William Suckling bought land from Viscount Palmerston in the 1840s and built Highwood House (now Stroud School), and the lane was later renamed Highwood Lane.

These two roads have each become troublesome because of people driving along them too fast. School Road the problem is being solved by blocking off the entrance from Braishfield Road which will prevent 'rat running'. In Highwood Lane, the Parish Council is still battling with fast cars in a 40 foot wide road. The speed limit is to be reduced to 40 miles an hour and there is now a footpath along the northern end of the road, but measures to enforce the speed limit are still needed and the corner by Stroud School is hazardous even when taken slowly.


